HUD Secretary Visits Savannah



HUD Secretary Shaun Donovan visited Savannah on January 9th to roll out HUD's new national Rental Assistance Demonstration Program (RAD). RAD is a pilot program that will allow public housing authorities to convert their public housing properties to long term Section 8 Rental Assistance contracts. RAD is a central part of HUD's rental housing preservation strategy, which works to preserve the nation's stock of deeply affordable rental housing.

HAS applied for the conversion of four of its public housing communities in September 2012 and received approval of all four

applications in January.
Georgia was among the leaders in the nation for number of applications received and Savannah was selected to host the Secretary's RAD

implementation event.



For the CNI planning process, this is significant. Two of the HAS neighborhoods, Fred Wessels Homes and Edgar Blackshear Homes, fall within the East Savannah Gateway. Fred Wessels Homes neighbors the as-yet developed Robert Hitch Village property and will be in the epicenter of redevelopment activity to be outlined in the Transformation Plan. East Savannah Gateway residents of the Wessels and Blackshear neighborhoods will become voucher holders with the subsidy tied to their units, similar to the traditional Project Based voucher program.

HAS is hopeful and excited about the new program and the potential for additional innovative financing opportunities for these neighborhoods with more flexibility than is provided with traditional public housing. The events of the day included a roundtable discussion at the HAS Neighborhood Resource Center with the Secretary and public, private and housing leaders from across the state of Georgia that included HAS Executive Director Earline Davis and Savannah Mayor Edna Jackson; followed by a local press conference at RAD site Wessels Homes; and a national media conference call.

CNI Team Hits the Road

Several members of the East Savannah Gateway Transformation Team spent some time in Atlanta this fall in the name of research. The Transformation Team was hosted by fellow planning partner Purpose Built Communities over a few days in September and October. On September 26th, a group of approximately twenty-five team members, including many East Savannah Gateway residents, took a day trip to Atlanta to visit the Villages of East Lake. In the mid-1990s, Atlanta's public housing community East Lake Meadows was known as "Little Vietnam" because of the rampant crime and violence. Today, thanks to the vision, generosity and planning of Tom Cousins and many others, the Villages of East Lake has been touted by many as *the* holistic model for neighborhood revitalization. The community includes the highest performing charter school in the state of Georgia, the Drew Charter School and a neighborhood YMCA.

After being welcomed by the Purpose Built Communities team and hearing the story of East Lake's revitalization, the team took a tour of the Villages of East Lake and the Drew Charter School. The tours were followed by a question and answer group discussion with Greg Giornelli, the President and COO of Purpose Built Communities.

Fred Wessels Homes resident Juliet Wade has been living in the East Savannah Gateway for nearly five years. Before moving to Fred Wessels Homes in February, Ms. Wade lived in Edgar Blackshear Homes. She is the proud mother of two boys, 19 and 20 years old. During her five years living in Blackshear, Ms. Wade has been active in her community. She is the current president of the HAS resident organization Neighborhood Residents at Work, Inc., a position she has held since 2011. For the past four years, she has been a member of the HAS strategic planning body, the Resident Advisory Board. She served as Chairman of that Board for the 2011-2012 planning year. She has also been an active member of the Blackshear Homes Residents Association and currently serves as the Vice President. She hopes to get involved in Wessels Resident activities once she settles in.

Ms. Wade shared some of her ideas for the planning process and the new development that is expected in the area. She loves the design of the City of Savannah's Savannah Gardens, located in the ESG on Pennsylvania Avenue. With the streets and park, she says "it looks like a home you want to live in." This simple vision is what captures her imagination for what is possible at the Robert Hitch Village site, next door to her new home. She also looks to Ashley Midtown as another example in the ESG of what is possible in her backyard.

Ms. Wade sees the necessity of community resource and counseling centers in the new community and organizations like St. Pius, which provide services to youth, seniors and those in need. Ms. Wade especially stresses the importance of having centers that meet the needs of youth to build their self-esteem. She sees healthy competition such as sports leagues in the area helping youth to grow in a beneficial way. Ms. Wade encourages her friends and neighbors and fellow community members to attend meetings in 2013 to let their voice be heard.

Master Developer for Hitch Village Announced

HAS is extremely excited to announce that the Hunt Development Group and TCG (The Communities Group) Team will be the master developer of the former Robert Hitch Village property, a cornerstone of the Transformation Plan. The Housing Taskforce will begin to move in a new direction as the development team comes on board.

The contract was awarded in November 2012 and the HUNT-TCG team is eager to get to work in Savannah. The vision for the former Robert Hitch Village public housing neighborhood is to be a vibrant mixed-use, mixed-income community providing connectivity between the Wheaton Street Corridor and the historic Savannah downtown.

The team led by Sinclair Cooper (the Hunt Group) and Jaime Bordenave (TCG) will be in Savannah on February 13th for a meet and greet with the Transformation Team. Mark your calendars and plan to drop by between 4:00-5:30 PM at the HAS Neighborhood Resource Center.
